

# Petition for Change of Name, Recognition of Change of Gender and Sex Identifier

## Who can submit Petitions for Name Change in Juvenile Court:

- A minor with a guardian who is appointed by the Juvenile court
- A minor with a court appointed dependency attorney appointed as guardian
- A minor who is alleged or adjudged to be a ward of the court
- A non-minor dependent
- An attorney acting for a minor under Welfare and Institution code sections 601 or 602

## What are the options to submit Petitions for Name Change in the Juvenile Court:

Petitions may be submitted in any one of the following options:

- In person at the Juvenile Justice Center [Click here for Court address](#)
- United States Mail [Click here for Court address](#)
- Drop box [Click here for Court address & drop box hours](#)

For the last three options, provide one original, and two copies of the required documents. If you request endorsed copies returned via US Mail, include a self-addressed stamped envelope along with your request.

Do not place Juvenile case number on the petition, instead submit CM015 Notice of Related Case along with your request.

## Change of Name Forms Used:

- NC-100 – Petition for Change of Name
- NC-110 – Name and Information About the Person Whose Name is to be Changed  
*\*Separate attachment for each person whose name is to be changed. If a petitioner is a guardian of a minor, a declaration of guardian form (NC-110G) must also be provided.*
- NC-120 – Order to Show Cause – Change of Name
- NC-125 – Order to Show Cause – Change of Name to Conform to Gender Identity
- NC-130 Decree Changing Name
- NC – 130G – Decree Changing Name of Minor (by Guardian)

## Recognition of Change of Gender and Sex Identifier Forms Used (18 years and older):

- NC-300 – Petition for Recognition of Change of Gender and Sex Identifier, Name Change, and Issuance of new Certificates
- NC-330 – Order Recognizing Change of Gender and Sex Identifier, for Name Change, and for Issuance of New Certificate.

- NC-110 – Name and Information About the Person Whose Name is to be Changed
- NC-125 – Order to Show Cause – Change of Name to Conform to Gender Identity.

### Recognition of Minor's change of Gender and Sex Identifier Forms used (under 18 years):

- NC-500 – Petition for Recognition of Minor's Change of Gender and Sex Identifier and for Issuance of New Birth Certificate and Change of Name
- NC-510G – Declaration of Guardian or Juvenile Attorney  
*\*Needed if the petition is filed by a guardian, by an attorney guardian ad litem, or an attorney acting for a minor under W&I section 601 or 602, or all of minor's parents are deceased or can't be located.*
- NC-530 – Order Recognizing Minor's Change of Gender and Sex Identifier, and for Issuance of New Birth Certificate.
- NC-110 – Name and Information About the Person Whose Name is to be Changed  
*\*Needed if the petition seeks a decree changing the minor's name.*
- NC-520 – Order to Show Cause- Recognition of Minor's Change of Gender and Issuance of New Birth Certificate  
*\*Needed if petition is not signed by all living parents of the minor; or is filed by a guardian, guardian ad litem, or attorney acting for a minor under W&I §601 or 602 and if all of minor's parents are deceased or can't be located; or seeks a decree changing the minor's name.*
