Fax filing & e-Delivery: Civil documents can not be fax filed or submitted by e-Delivery after Friday, 10/8 at 4:00pm. Instead, you can <u>e-file</u>! Fax filing will continue to be available for Family and Probate filings. Learn more on the <u>Fax filing</u> webpage.



DomainWeb: Civil cases will no longer be available via DomainWeb as of Thursday, 10/7 at 5:00pm. Instead, you will go to the new <u>eCourt Public</u> <u>Portal</u> starting on Tuesday, 10/12. DomainWeb will continue to provide remote public access for Probate cases. Learn more on the <u>DomainWeb webpage</u>.



Email the Department: After Friday, 10/8, do not email the department to reserve a hearing. Instead, register on the Public Portal and make your reservation online! Learn more about the new Case Reservation System on the Case Reservation page on the <u>eCourt Public Portal</u>.

e-filing: Civil e-filing includes general civil, small claims, unlawful detainers, civil harassment restraining orders, and civil appeals case types. Civil e-filing is permissive until January 1, 2022. Learn more on the <u>civil e-filing webpage</u>.



eCourt Public Portal: View civil case records, calendars, and documents through searches, and calendar reports. View Direct Calendar and Civil Complex Courtroom information, access the ADR portal by visiting the <u>eCourt Public Portal</u> site. Parties will have access to their case, even confidential cases.

Case Reservation System: The Court
